

Community Behavioral Health: Provider Notification Social (Pragmatic) Communication Disorder August 1, 2016

The DSM-5 added a new diagnosis of Social (Pragmatic) Communication Disorder 315.39 (F80.89). This diagnosis requires that Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) has been ruled out. It is most commonly diagnosed and treated by a speech-language pathologist. In the event that a child with Social (Pragmatic) Communication Disorder is approved for BSC services, the BSC must be a Licensed Psychologist, Licensed Behavior Specialist, Licensed Social Worker, Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist, Licensed Clinical Social Worker, or Licensed Professional Counselors and meet all the requirements of a BSC treating a child with Autism Spectrum Disorder to account for the similarities between Autism Spectrum Disorder and Social (Pragmatic) Communication Disorder.
