Agenda

I. Review of Agenda

Dr. Faith Dyson Washington reviewed the agenda.

II. Welcome & Introductions

Three (3) new Coordinating Council members were introduced - Karyn Lynch (School District of Philadelphia); Alex Dutton (Community Legal Services of Philadelphia), and Adaminah Solita Tankersly (Parent Representative)

Members of the council introduced themselves and stated their agency/organization.

III. IBHS Coordinating Council Charter

Dr. Tamra Williams reviewed the IBHS Coordinating Council charter and highlighted the mission/vision of the Coordinating Council, the role of the members, and the voting structure. Council members were asked to review the charter and provide feedback to Stacey Golonka by Friday, March 26, 2021.

IV. Updates

Julia Hinckley walked Council members through the IBHS Virtual Expectation Chart, which details the expectations for IBHS pre-pandemic and the current expectations now that the School District of Philadelphia is resuming in-person classrooms for some grades. The document outlines the expectations for the specific IBHS services and whether they will be offered in-person or virtual. The document is a live document and any updates will be shared with the Committee on an ongoing basis.

V. Next Steps

The next Coordinating Council meeting will focus on what treatment services are reimbursable through Medicaid and what services are available through the school district. Provider members were asked to contact Stacey Golonka if they would like to present on services available through their agency.

Questions:

Question: Will the Coordinating Council have access to dashboards regarding IBHS data?

Answer: For IBHS, there are three specific, clinically related outcomes. This group will look at those three outcomes and the associated data. CBH will be able to share the data on an aggregated level. If there is a need for additional outcomes, this group will be used to establish how to gather that data and who is responsible for gathering it.

Question: Is there a dedicated outcome measure for social determinants of health (SDOH)?

Answer: IBHS providers will be collecting SDOH data.

Question: Are there report cards for the agencies selected to provide IBHS, to include provider specialties?

Answer:

Provider Profiles (Report Cards) have taken various forms over the years and were developed to provide an overview of each provider facility at the corporate level while emphasizing several general performance categories across each contracted level of care (LOC). CBH is in the process of developing LOC (or service) specific Performance Standards against which providers will be evaluated. Our goal is to produce Provider Score Cards that reflect a more robust and substantive overview, which will be aligned with the Performance Standards. CBH continues to encourage members, providers, and stakeholders to access the interactive [Provider Directory](#) on the CBH website when information is needed about a provider or service. In the interim, we will put the IBHS Provider Profiles under the IBHS tab on the CBH website.

Question: What are IBHS providers doing around gun violence and what is the school protocol for when violence occurs?

Answer: Following any traumatic event or critical incident, including gun violence, the SDP Prevention and Intervention (P&I) liaisons engage to assess what resources are needed to address the incident, and support the students impacted, the school community and the surrounding neighborhood. The P&I liaison identifies support plans to help students and faculty in the school which may include a request for support from IBHS providers, SAP (the Student Assistance Program) and Network of Neighbors.

Question: What could and should we be doing in terms of conflict resolution and mediation?

Answer: There is a lot of work being done under prevention. Prevention providers are in schools doing conflict resolution and skill building with the youth. There is also an opportunity to support ways in which IBHS providers can lend to processes that are already taking place.

Question: Will CBH push to move services to in-person?

Answer: Our focus has been on keeping things flexible. We're waiting to see how vaccinations go across the city and we will continue to discuss how services will be implemented.
