

COVID-19 Vaccination Information for Providers and Members

Participants can call 311 or fill out the [online Vaccine Interest Form](#) to sign up for vaccination with the City at either the Convention Center, community mass clinic, or pharmacy. The City is holding mass clinics in North and West Philadelphia (500 vaccines per day), multiple days a week.

The FEMA site at the Convention Center is vaccinating 6,000 people a day. Those interested in receiving the vaccination need to sign up with the city to get an appointment. The turnaround time is quick right now due to the large volume of appointments and the short wait times at the Convention Center.

Another option for those looking to get vaccinated could be the Black Doctors Covid Consortium. The organization is conducting walk-up appointments based on zip code. This option may require some wait time depending on day and time. For more information, [click here](#).

Individuals can also reach out to their healthcare provider to see if they are able to provide vaccination. Larger healthcare systems such as Penn and Jefferson have their own signups for patients. Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) have their own supply of vaccines and may be able to make appointments for individuals who come onsite.
