What is Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS)?


Pennsylvania's Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) is a:

- comprehensive school improvement FRAMEWORK for enhancing academic, behavioral and social-emotional outcomes for ALL students.
- An integrated MTSS framework considers students' academic, social-emotional/behavioral, attendance, and health/wellness needs simultaneously.
- This whole-child focus helps ensure that the root causes of students' challenges are identified and viewed in context.
- Through this integrated approach, MTSS ensures equity in opportunity for students--including Black/African American and Latinx students, students with disabilities, and English Language Learners--who have been marginalized and negatively impacted by existing systems.

Essential Components of MTSS

- High-Quality Core Instruction
- Positive School-wide Climate Programming
- Universal Screening
- Shared Ownership
- Data-Based Decision-Making
- Family Engagement
- Professional Learning
- Resources


Multi-tiered Supports




Basic ingredients of MTSS at each tier:

- Teams of school-level leaders, staff, and partners
- Continuous Progress Monitoring
- Evidence-based practices and interventions
- Data to inform decisions about student barriers and progress

MTSS is a comprehensive process of ensuring high-quality services at three tiers.



- → Tier 1: Supports for all students (e.g., grade-level instruction, schoolwide climate, Social-Emotional Learning)
- → Tier 2: Supports for some students (e.g., small-group interventions)
- → Tier 3: Supports for a few students (e.g., individualized supports)



- In many of our schools, the triangle is inverted where more students receive Tier 3 supports than, Tier 1 and 2.
- This school year across the district, there will be an intense focus on establishing solid Tier 1 practices. This is imperative to "flipping the triangle" right-side up.

By using MTSS, we make sure we meet all students' needs by:

- Effectively teaming with school-level leaders, staff, families, and partners
- Selecting evidence-based programming that we know can work
- Continually solving problems and improving implementation
- ✓ "Flipping the triangle" so that far fewer students require Tiers 2 and 3 supports
