

Adherence To Antipsychotic Medications for Individuals with Schizophrenia

CBH is committed to ensuring members receive quality care. Monitoring adherence to medications is one such way to improve quality of care. Members with a diagnosis of schizophrenia spectrum and psychotic disorders require adherence to medications for adequate symptom and disease management. Adherence to antipsychotic medications may reduce psychiatric morbidity and cost of care. Providers play a crucial role in supporting members' adherence to medications.

Best Practices

- Assess members' adherence at each visit. Use a tool such as the <u>M.A.R.S. Calculator</u>.
- Ensure member has an adequate supply of medications and refills.
- Share the <u>CBH Antipsychotic Medication Guide</u> with your members.
- Address members' specific barriers to antipsychotic adherence. Refer to the <u>PA DHS</u> <u>Preferred Drug List</u> to see which medications are preferred.
- Assess if member is a candidate for a longacting injectable (LAI) antipsychotic to improve adherence. Refer to CBH's <u>Pharmacy Resources</u> for <u>Providers webpage</u>.
- Engage in shared decision-making such that members are at the center of care. Learn more in <u>SAMHSA: Shared Decision-Making in Mental</u> <u>Health Care</u>.
- Collaborate with the member's primary care physician.
