

## Implementation of Screening Tools and Submission of Performance Measure Data for Statewide OMHSAS PIP – Improving Suicide Prevention and Community Resilience

As required by PA DHS ([OMHSAS](#)) and outlined in [CBH Provider Bulletin 25-17](#), providers will be responsible for implementing screening tools for depression, suicide risk, and social determinants of health (SDOH). This bulletin outlines the requirements for implementation of required screening tools and submission of data for performance measures.

### Screening Tool Requirements

CBH aims to ensure that quality care is provided to all members and has adopted standardized screening tools considered as the best practice to address screening for depression, suicide risk, and SDOH. All CBH providers will be required to implement the following screening tools within 30 days of this bulletin notification. CBH has published an [HL7 Submission Guide](#), available on the CBH website's [Provider Manual page](#) under the "Additional Documents" tab. Providers will also be notified via the [Provider News Blast](#) of available screening program guidelines and training opportunities when they become available.

### Performance Measure Data Submission

Beginning September 2, 2025, CBH will begin collecting screening results from providers via HL7 Version 2.5.1 ORU^R01 message version, in accordance with the [HL7 Implementation Guide](#) for batch processing and via claims data. Providers will submit HL7 files via IPSWITCH and submission of files should be uploaded to the HL7 subfolder. All files should use the following naming convention:

“par.xxxx\_HL7\_YYYYMMDD.HL7”

XXXX refers to your respective 4-digit parent ID number. The date should be the date the file is uploaded into IPSWITCH.

CBH has posted an HL7 Submission Guide and will provide additional guidance on this process in upcoming trainings and Provider News Blast messaging. At a minimum, providers will be expected to submit the following information for each screening tool:
